Home Insurance

Millbrook First Nation's insurance covers the structural costs of CMHC houses and Millbrook-owned homes on reserve. Please note that the contents inside the homes, including the appliances, are not insured by Millbrook First Nation. It is important to protect your belongings and one way to do that is to consider purchasing home insurance for the contents of your home. This became apparent after the recent flooding of basements that occurred in Millbrook's communities last year. If Millbrook members are interested in home contents insurance, they will be responsible and it will not be covered by the First Nation. Questions? Housing Inspections

The Housing Department has been working collaboratively with other organizations and government agencies with the hopes of obtaining funding for housing repairs. In order to be eligible for the housing repairs, housing inspections will be mandatory for the funding.

Those who contact the Housing Department to be added to the list will be first priority, but it's mandatory for all houses to be inspected. Anyone who doesn't answer the door for their scheduled appointment will be dropped down to the end of the list.



2023 Community Deer Harvest

Dear band members,

The 2023 community deer harvest is well under way. Millbrook First Nation is currently managing two harvesting sites off-reserve on William Barnhill drive. Harvesters have been recruited from our community and we have partnered with David ("Tex") MacLeod from Farmland Outfitters to coordinate the hunt. Our goal for the season is to safely harvest 24 deer to help ethically manage the overpopulation of deer in the Truro area.

Our approach consists of crossbow hunting from a tree stand and compound bow hunting from a ground blind. In both cases, hunters will be shooting away from homes and community infrastructure and will be shooting down toward the ground (from a tree stand) or into a hillside (from a blind). This is intended to ensure that all projectiles are discharged safely.

All meat harvested this year will be shared with the community at large, with a portion being donated to the Springhill Penitentiary (to feed Indigenous inmates) and the Mi'kmaw Native Friendship Centre (to help the urban Indigenous community access traditional foods). We will be giving away deer meat at the **Cole Harbour A-Frame** and the **Sheet Harbour Wharf** in December.

We have also partnered with Chef Ray Bear and the Health Centre to develop a Hello Fresh inspired meal kit with deer meat as the protein. Chef Ray is developing 3 recipes that will be circulated in mid-late November. All meal kits will come with recipe cards and ingredients. 




Royal Canadian Mounted Police Eagle Smudging Ceremony

Thursday morning, The Nova Scotia RCMP held an Eagle Smudging Ceremony with Patsy Paul Martin.

In 2017, Nova Scotia RCMP was the first to offer victims, witnesses and police officers the option to swear legal oaths on an eagle feather instead of using a Bible or offering an affirmation, with the help of Don Julien and the late Jane Abram at the RCMP headquarters.

Having eagle feathers available at the RCMP Stations has been a big step in reconciliation amongst the Indigenous population. Chief Bob Gloade: "We have a great relationship with our RCMP detachment, which has been fundamental in improving community wellness; our local RCMP will join us at every local event and ceremony. Our youth look up to these officers, and they promote many good things around here."

During this ceremony, Patsy cleansed the eagle feathers through a smudging ceremony, and Chief

"It gives Indigenous youth the opportunity to experience a training session and a first-hand view of what a possible career in police work could entail," says Cpl. Maureen Greyeyes-Brant, who was a graduate of the program and is now the National Coordinator.

- An introduction to the Criminal Code and RCMP policy
- Physical fitness and drill
- Skills to help prepare you to apply to be a police officer.




Community and Public Safety Phone Line

Millbrook's Security Services

Millbrook's security team is responsible for keeping Millbrook's community safe and secure. They work around the clock and are on call 24 hours a day. Their duties include patrolling the neighbourhoods of Millbrook and Cole Harbour because having a physical presence in the community is a deterrent for minor damage or other unsavoury activities. They are trained to identify unusual activity and pay attention to detail to reduce risks to the community. In addition, they observe and report suspicious activity that may be criminal.



INSTRUCTIONS FOR SCHOOL BUS PASSENGERS

- 1. The Driver is in full charge of the school bus. Obey his/her instructions.
- 2. Be on time. The bus will not wait.
- 3. Do not talk to the bus driver unless necessary.
- 4. Keep seat assigned to you by the driver.
- 5. Do not use foul or profane language.
- 6. No loud or boisterous talking, yelling or whistling.
- Do not stand or move about while the bus is in motion.
- 8. Do not open windows without the driver's permission.
- 9. Do not put hands, arms, feet or head out of the bus window.
- 10.Do not throw anything inside the bus or out the windows.
- 11. When the bus is in motion, keep the aisle of the bus clear at all times.
- 12. When it is necessary to cross the road in front of the school bus, walk 3 meters (10ft) in front of the school bus to a point where you can see the driver; cross to the center of the highway, STOP, LOOK, and LISTEN and cross the highway when it is safe to do so.
- 13.If there is no sideway, walk well over the left side of the road when walking to and from the bus.
- 14. Never stand or play on the road while waiting for the bus.
- 15. The maximum seating capacity for this bus is 48 passengers provided the aisle of the school bus is neither wholly or partially obstructed by any person sitting in such a manner that the persons body or any part of there of, extends beyond a seat into the aisle.
- 16. No Smoking or Vaping on the school bus at any time!

Millbrook Tobacco Store Funding Regulations

- Only Millbrook Band Members are eligible to receive funding.
- B. All requests must be made individually in writing on the form, available at the Millbrook Band Office or Millbrook website and approved by a majority of the Millbrook Band Council. All approvals are on a fiscal year basis.
- C. All reimbursements will require an official RECEIPT from the organization showing the organization name, the name of the individual the activity is for, the activity name and amount. All funding requests payable to the organization will require an INVOICE from the organization showing; the organization name, the name of the individual activity is for, the activity name and amount. The cheque will be mailed directly to the organization along with a letter sating that any refunds are to be paid to the tobacco store.
- All approvals are subject to the Tebacco Store having funds in excess of normal operating expenses.
- E. Band Members may apply for reimbursements for activities from the previous fiscal year if they have official receipts.
- F. All requests for changes/additions to the Millbrook Tsbacco Store Funding Regulations must be in writing and submitted to the Millbrook Band Council. The request will be reviewed at the next scheduled Council Meeting and must be approved by a majority of the Millbrook Band Council before be added to the Funding Regulation listing.

The Millbrook Tobacco Store will fund the sport and recreational activities listed below:

- Any high performance physical activity athletes (elite level/competitive/provincial team/school sport team) for children 18 years of age and under, will be funded to a maximum of \$3,000.00 per year for registration free.
- Any on-going sport or physical activity for children 18 years of age and under and adults 19-23 years of
 age as full-time students or enrolled in a full time, post-secondary education program will be funded
 to a maximum of \$750.00 per year, per category. If a fee in addition to the regular registration is required to
 participate on a team it will be funded up to a further \$300.00 per year. Ticket funds not applicable.
- The minor backey registration for children 18 years and under will be funded/reimbursed up to a maximum of \$850.00 per year and REP fees up to a further \$400 per year.
- Necessary equipment will be reimbursed up to \$300.00 for children 18 years and under, every year. This
 is intotal, not for each separate funded activity. The child must be registered with a team, club or other
 organized entity to be eligible.
- 5. Music classes, Art/Cultural Artelasses, Mi'kmaw Language classes, Girl Guides and Scout registration fees for children 18 years of age and under and adults 19-23 years of age as full-time students or enrelled in a full time, post-secondary education program will be funded to a maximum of \$300.00 per year each. Completed Regalia (purchase NOT supplies to make) for children 18 years of age and under will be funded to a maximum of \$300, every two (2) years, as long as they are enrolled in a full time, post-secondary education program.
- 6. Adults participating in organized and or-going sport or physical activities will be furded to a maximum of \$300,00 per year. The exception is that teams, that consist of a majority of Millbrook Band members, will be funded to a maximum of \$2,000.00 for Millbrook sponsored teams and \$1,000.00 for teams sponsored by other business or organization.
 Seniors (654) golf will be funded to a maximum of \$600 per year.
- 7. Adult Music classes, Art/Cultural Art classes, M*kmaw language classes, Cooking classes, Firearm Safety courses, medically approved weight loss programs (Weight Watchers, Simply for Lifz, Ideal Protein and Herbal Magic) will be funded to a maximum of \$300.00 per year. Seniors (65+) Art/Cultural Art classes will be funded to a maximum of \$600 per year. Seniors (60+) and disabled participating in a First Nation community organized St. Anne de Beaupre Pilgrimage (with a First Nation Organization registration receipt) will be funded to a maximum of \$300 per year.
- Equipment not supplied as part of the registration fee is not funded, except as stated in these regulations.
- Instructors for organized courses (that are pre-approved at a Band Council Meeting) will be paid \$20.00 per hour. Materials will be funded at \$50.00 per student per year, if necessary. Each course will be funded to a maximum of \$1,500.00.
- 10. Necessary fitness equipment for the Milbrook Gymnasium will be funded.
- Sunday morning family skate and family swim, as scheduled, at the RATH Eastlink Civic Centre, will be funded at cost.
